Dear Members and Friends of MPC,



# We welcome Marcy Doak back to MPC as our Administrative Assistant



Throughout the pandemic, the Mission Committee has remained in contact, by phone, with all of the missions we support. The committee is currently working on plans for a local mission opportunity this fall that the entire congregation can participate in, while still following the COVID guidelines.





This year has not gone the way any of us had anticipated. Given the pandemic and its uncertainties, planning for 2021, preparing the budget, and conducting our annual stewardship campaign for that budget are real challenges. We must recognize, though, that since COVID started, many things have not changed. We have worshipped God together every Sunday morning at 10:30, and, although it has been virtual for us, God still calls us together. Bible studies have occurred every Wednesday night. Children and youth are still being formed in the faith. One positive change that has occurred is that we have increased our missions giving to meet the ongoing and increasing needs of our community. None of this has come easily and none it has come the way we wanted it, but the church has not ceased being the church.

Furthermore, giving has been remarkably good. Although we have experienced a recent downward trend in weekly revenue, we are not sure whether to attribute that to COVID or the normal dip in giving during the summer months. We look forward to restoring the pace as the year goes on.

The year's Stewardship Campaign will start on October 18<sup>th</sup> and will culminate on Dedication Sunday on November 15<sup>th</sup>. This year's theme is simply "The Ongoing Church." It sounds simple and not very exciting, but that the work of the church is still being done even though we cannot meet for worship is remarkable and should be celebrated. That lives are being changed, that God is still calling us together, that the community is still being served... that the church is still being the church in these difficult times all testify to God's ongoing faithfulness, sovereignty, and grace.

As we do every year, we will send you a stewardship packet close to when the season begins on October 18<sup>th</sup>. This packet will include a full budget request from every committee. We will then craft a budget based off the congregation's pledges, historical trends in giving, and mostly off what we believe God is calling us to be and do.

Thank you for your faithful giving to God's church, especially in the midst of such an uncertain time as this. God is doing a good thing in our midst. The work of the church has not stopped or even slowed down. COVID has touched all aspects of our lives, including the ministry of Matthews Presbyterian Church. Yet the church is still very much doing the work of the church. God is doing a good thing among us and we have an opportunity through our prayers, activities, and financial giving to be a part of it.



### **Music Ministry During Coronavirus**

This pandemic has us all thinking about all the things we can't do. That is certainly true for MPC's Music Ministry. With singing being a super spreading activity, there are lots of things we can't do.

But, there are things we can do!

Early in our quarantine time, a lot of our church musicians were featured in Daily Devotions and Music Mondays. These are still available on our Facebook page if you want to check them out. As we continued to explore the things we can do, we added a monthly outdoor hymn sing, which will continue through the fall. The next one is September 16 at 7pm. In addition, we put together recording groups to add some variety to the hymn singing in our pre-recorded worship services.

Now, as we look towards fall, we are finding more things we can do. Spirit Ringers will resume on most Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm, spread out in the sanctuary. Music will be a part of both our youth and children's programming on Sunday and Wednesday nights respectively. We are so fortunate to have lots of wonderful musical equipment to facilitate music making in this social distancing era. Xylophones, drums, hand chimes, children's bells, and other various percussion instruments will all be used by different groups with proper cleaning afterwards, of course. All this music will be featured in our services on Sunday via Facebook.

We surely miss singing together in the ways we used to do. We look forward to the day we can return. But for now, we will make the most of the things we can do, and we will do them safely to the glory of God!

# Digging Deeper

In addition to a global pandemic, just in case you may have forgotten, we are also having a national election this fall. Every side of every election has Christians on it, reading the same Bible, praying to the same God, and yet rooting hard against one another. This election is no exception. In fact, the role of faith is heightened this time. Division, anxiety, and rhetoric are all heightened. The prospect for a peaceful fall looks particularly bleak.

So what can we Christians do regarding the election? I would offer several words of advice. First, seek the truth. Jesus promised us that we can know the truth and that the truth will set us free. Between fake news and alternative facts, it's hard to know where truth lies, but if we look hard enough and humble ourselves, I think we can discern it.

Second, don't demonize the other side. Most of us feel strongly in favor of one candidate and therefore strongly against the other, which is fine. But refrain from demonizing people who feel just as strongly in the opposite direction. Seek to understand more so than to be understood. Maybe, just for kicks, try to make a case for the *other* candidate. You might learn something. By the time you read the next newsletter, after all, this election will be over... and we will have to live with one another.

Fourth, vote your conscience. Consider all the facts, consider the character of the candidates, consider what this country needs for such a time as this, consider who is most Christlike, and go into that booth and pull the appropriate lever. If you're a lifelong member of a political party and your conscience is telling you that you just can't vote for that guy this time, but the other guy, then go hold your nose and pull the lever in the other guy's favor.

Finally, know that this election, as consequential as it is, is far from what counts the most. God is sovereign and God is gracious. The most important election, after all, is that God has elected us, the church, for salvation as well as service. Don't forget that. Therefore, whatever the outcome on November 3<sup>rd</sup> (and let's pray that there is a clear outcome), be gracious in victory and magnanimous in defeat. Or, to quote my favorite Presbyterian president (he was never formally Presbyterian, but worshipped often at New York Avenue Presbyterian Church during office), "with malice towards none and charity for all, and with firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right."



#### **Sunday School**

Fall 2020 brings many different changes, including the way in which we do Sunday School. However, in this time of change and being apart, we will still find new ways to be together. For our preschool and elementary group, their parents can expect an email each week with a short pre-recorded Sunday School lesson that the kids can watch.

Our youth will be taking a hiatus from Sunday School this fall, as they will have a new opportunity to gather through the opening of our youth lounge for virtual learning, and they will gather for youth group on Sunday nights.

The four adult Sunday School classes are working on different ways to meet that best suits each class. Our young parent class, Faith & Fellowship, has decided to take a break this fall, as it is difficult for them to schedule a good meeting time with little ones at home. #### **Youth Opportunities**

Youth this year is going to be structured differently than it has been in the past, providing new and different opportunities. With virtual learning being the new reality, we decided to open our youth spaces on Mondays and Tuesdays to provide an opportunity for our middle schoolers and high schoolers to get out of the house and have a change of scenery as they do online learning. As the MPC staff and CESG committee, we are so excited that this is a possibility, as we think it will greatly help students to be in the presence of others and feel a sense of community.

In addition to this new opportunity, youth group is also structured in a different way than it has been in the past. Typically, we have one fellowship night a month, one mission night, and two discussion nights. This year since mission nights are much harder to do (we typically visit somewhere such as Samaritan's House), youth will have three different parts each week: music, devotion/discussion, and fellowship. The youth will be split into groups of 10 based on age, and each group will rotate through those three different sections.

The CESG committee is grateful that we are able to host in-person youth events in a safe way at this time. Masks, temperature checks, and hand-washing are required at every event.

#### **Children's Education Opportunities**


We have several different ministries happening this year for the children of MPC. Please read about each below:


#### **AMP**

Parents were given the opportunity to sign their kids up for AMP this year, knowing that there would be a mask requirement and different social distancing procedures in place. Once kids signed up, they were split into groups of 5 and assigned a specific Wednesday of the month. Each group gets to come once a month. At AMP they will have a time for music, fellowship, games and art in addition to their educational piece. The two younger AMP groups will be completing a fun worship education curriculum! The older group will be learning all about baptism and communion.

#### Preschool Pals

As it might be difficult for our younger children to wear masks and properly social distance, we've configured and come up with a safe outdoor ministry for children ages 2-4 and their parents to participate in! The first and third Wednesday of every month, for 30 minutes, parents and preschool children will come and gather on the church lawn to hear a Bible story and do silly songs.
