As such, we have much to give and anticipate. When I first got here, I told a leader in town that we were land-locked and therefore limited. He told me that was nonsense. The church is the only organization in town, he said, that has God on its side. He was right. That does not imply that we can do anything we want, but it does mean that we can give freely and unsparingly in the Lord's work. Last I checked, God's budget never ran a deficit.

This church is in a great spot, literally and figuratively. We have been through some difficult challenges lately. We are living in a new normal and have found that, like the old normal, God is present, sovereign, and good. God is on our side giving us good work to do and meaningful lives to live together. That assurance is worth our investments of time, energy, prayers, and money. Covid or no-Covid, God has given us that for which we have always hoped, but never had the wisdom to want.

MPC is a great community in which we can live out our hope and faith together. You can read in this newsletter of the good things that God is doing here, and you can dream of so much more that God can and will do through our faith and generosity. The big news around here has always been what God is doing. Through God's grace, that headline will remain for an eternally long time.

GROW IN FAITH

Digging Deeper by Pastor Luke


The American experiment is one of self-government. Can a government be truly of, by, and for the people? Can people come together to rule themselves? Compared to other nations, even now, after almost two hundred years, we are a young nation, and the results of that experiment remain to be seen. So far, at least, the answer is a resounding yes. Not only can we govern ourselves, but self-government is by far the best kind of government to have.

The other, less known, American experiment is about the church. Before American self-government, governments were always connected to a church, and – more importantly – the church was connected to them. When people of those nations paid taxes, those taxes supported the church. Stewardship campaigns were nothing more than tax bills. The experiment for the American church, then, is could it support itself without government and taxpayer support?

Much like the experiment on self-government, the result has been a resounding "yes". In fact, the church has flourished in America much more so that it has in Europe, where it remains supported by the government. In other words, people respond much better in freedom than coercion.

Yet, that experiment is still early. The church has been supported by governments for most of its existence, since Roman Emperor Constantine converted to Christianity in 325. So this uniquely American experiment still remains to be seen. Can the church live and thrive with free-will offerings, especially in these days when the church seems to have lost its central place in culture?

We Christians hold fast to the idea that this is God's Church, that God has created, ordained, anointed, and will maintain it. The answer to the experiment, then, is still "yes" but only because God is faithful. Will the church remain faithful, too? That is the big question that we must answer for such a time and place as this.



Sunday School

Sunday school this year is off to a safe and cautious start! Both the Explorers and the Living and Learning God's Word class are meeting in person with masks and offering a virtual option on Zoom. The Explorers class just finished up the book of Job, and are picking a new topic to explore. The Living and Learning class is beginning their exploration of 1 Thessalonians.

This year we decided not to have Sunday School for kids in our elementary and middle/high school groups due to low attendance. In lieu of this, we are doing 5th Sunday events that are intergenerational immediately after church. There is a 5th Sunday in October that falls on Halloween, because of this we've decided to host this event on Sunday, Nov 7th instead after worship from 11:30-12:15. Everyone is invited to come and make cards to go in this year's Thanksgiving baskets that MPC will be giving to families in need. We will also be working on Chrismon ornaments that will go on the tree in the chapel building.

Mom's Book Study

Pre-Covid, Sarah Evans was leading a book study for moms, particularly moms of preschool aged children. The group was scheduled so that parents of children in our CDC would be able to attend. This fall they have picked back up, and are learning and growing together. The group is reading *Raising Good Humans*. The book discusses mindful parenting and how to overcome our own stressors, worries, etc. It gives useful strategies of how to parent from a place of understanding, instead of out of initial reactions. The groups meets each Friday from 11:45-12:45 in room 205.

Youth & Children Christian Education News from Sarah Evans:

The youth have had a full schedule this fall! We have done several fun fellowship events such as a corn maze, glow in the dark mini golf, a Halloween party, and we still have more to come! In our discussion nights we've explored how our faith connects us to one another, and how we can help hold one another accountable when we are tempted to act in ways that we know don't line up with our faith. We've also discussed how diversity can bring us closer together and set guidelines for how we want to treat each other in conversation when we may disagree. For our missions, we are working to supply sandwiches and other goodies for The Relatives Youth Crisis Center. We are new to helping this organization, but it is safe for both us and them, as we can prepare donations for them on our campus and have someone deliver the items to them at a later date, decreasing possible Covid exposure. We are excited to work with them, as they serve children and youth similar to the ages of our youth group. The youth are looking forward to Advent, as this year they will have a bigger part in helping decorate the chapel for our Christmas programs and services.

Our children's ministries are running well, and our AMP program has benefitted from being back to a more normal schedule than we were on last year. Each week the children gather for dinner outside, then have a time for music, crafts, a lesson, and for games. They are also currently starting to work on their Christmas play that will be on Wednesday, December 8th. In our lessons this year we have been discussing different theological ideas through children's literature. We have discussed the idea of unity, what it means to be made in God's image, how to overcome division, what to do when we worry, inclusion, and more.

In addition to our AMP program, we also offer Noah's Chapel and worship bags in the sanctuary. The children have been loving the worship bags and parents find them very helpful to aid their children in focusing and learning at church. Each worship bag has a special children's bulletin that works for both readers and non-readers and corresponds with the lectionary text each week.



Once again, Matthews Presbyterian Church Child Development Center looks a little different than years past. Even with all the changes, our classrooms continue to be filled with learning and laughter every day! The infant class is enjoying art with lots of footprints and fingerprints. Our toddlers have mastered morning circle time and are learning the names of all their friends. The 2-year-old class celebrated fall by going on a leaf hunt and took their collection home to share with their family. Our 3-year-old class has been learning all about Mat Man and made beautiful fall pictures by painting with apples. The 4-year-olds are deep into the Learning Without Tears curriculum and enjoyed making Halloween slime. The staff at MPC-CDC are enjoying watching these children grow while they are in our care!
