## Digging Deeper

The session held several congregational gatherings last May to present some ideas on the chapel building. The first was demolishing the entire structure, otherwise knowns as "renovating the front lawn." The second option was renovating the entire structure. The last, and one that seemed most compelling at the time, was to demolish the education wing and renovate just the old chapel. The church's programming no longer requires all that space and renovating only half of that building, we thought, would be more cost effective.

The task force has been meeting with architects all summer, all of whom concluded that tearing down only half of the building was problematic because it would compromise the entire structure, would require additional construction costs, and would likely be more expensive than repairing the entire structure. The general contractor we were using also had to back out recently, which required us to find another one. Repairing old church structures is a small niche in the construction marketplace, so finding contractors to do that can be difficult. Once those costs are established, the session will call other congregational gatherings to present them to you. Those costs need to include the repair itself and anticipated future maintenance costs, all the while maintaining the new building.

Regardless of what decision is made regarding the chapel, we will need to raise additional funds, which will require a capital campaign that asks you to give over and above your pledge. Our campus is situated on some of the most coveted property in Matthews. Our buildings are fundamental to the character of the town and hold so much potential to do the Lord's work. Our final goal is to be the church in the world, specifically in Matthews, NC. We are excited about the direction that God is leading us and we look forward to presenting further findings to you as we discern together what that direction is and what it requires of us.

# 2024 Financial Summary As of July 31, 2024

Below is the financial summary as of July 31, 2024, provided by the Finance Committee. Revenues are running slightly behind the budget, while expenses are well below projections. The primary cause of the cash flow surplus for the first seven months of the year is the absence of a full-time music director, and lower than expected church maintenance costs.
